The International Classification of Functioning, Health, and Disability (ICF) Workshop, held over two days, at the College of Physiotherapy, Dayananda Sagar University from 18-06-2024 to 19-06-2024. The program started at 10 am with the formal inaugural function followed by the prayer, Dr. SathyaGuruprasad Principal College of Physiotherapy, DSU, and Dr. Alakananda Banerjee founder Chairperson of Dharma Foundation. The first day of the workshop focused on introducing the participants to the ICF framework. Dr. Alakananda Banerjee, Dr. Robins Kumar and Dr. Gayathri Poojary provided an overview of the key concepts and components of the ICF. They explained how the ICF goes beyond a purely medical model by considering social, environmental, and personal factors that influence health and functioning.

Day 2: Applications of the ICF in Healthcare Settings, Hands-on session

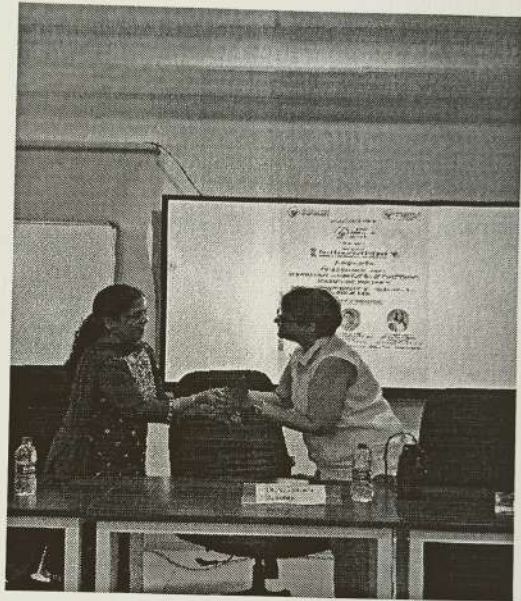
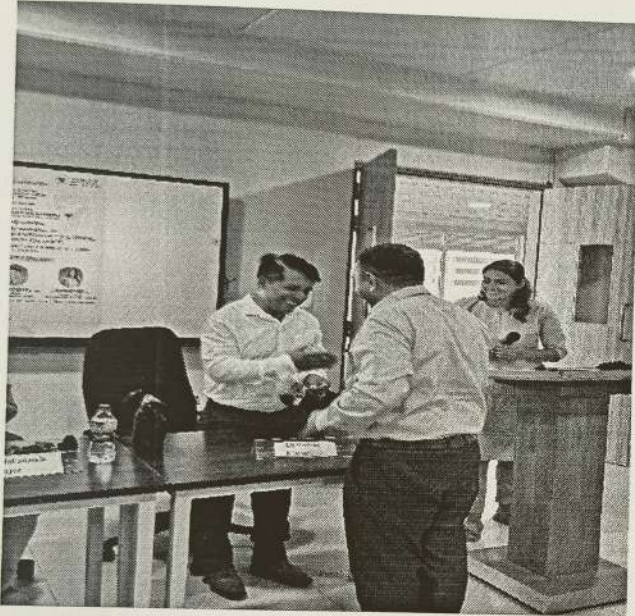
On the second day, the workshop delved into the practical applications of the ICF in healthcare settings. Case studies were presented, showcasing how healthcare professionals have successfully integrated the ICF into their clinical practice. Participants engaged in lively discussions, sharing their experiences and challenges in implementing the ICF framework.

Students discussed the importance of using a biopsychosocial approach and its clinical application. Participants actively contributed to the discussion, highlighting successful initiatives and advocating for greater inclusivity in healthcare systems.
