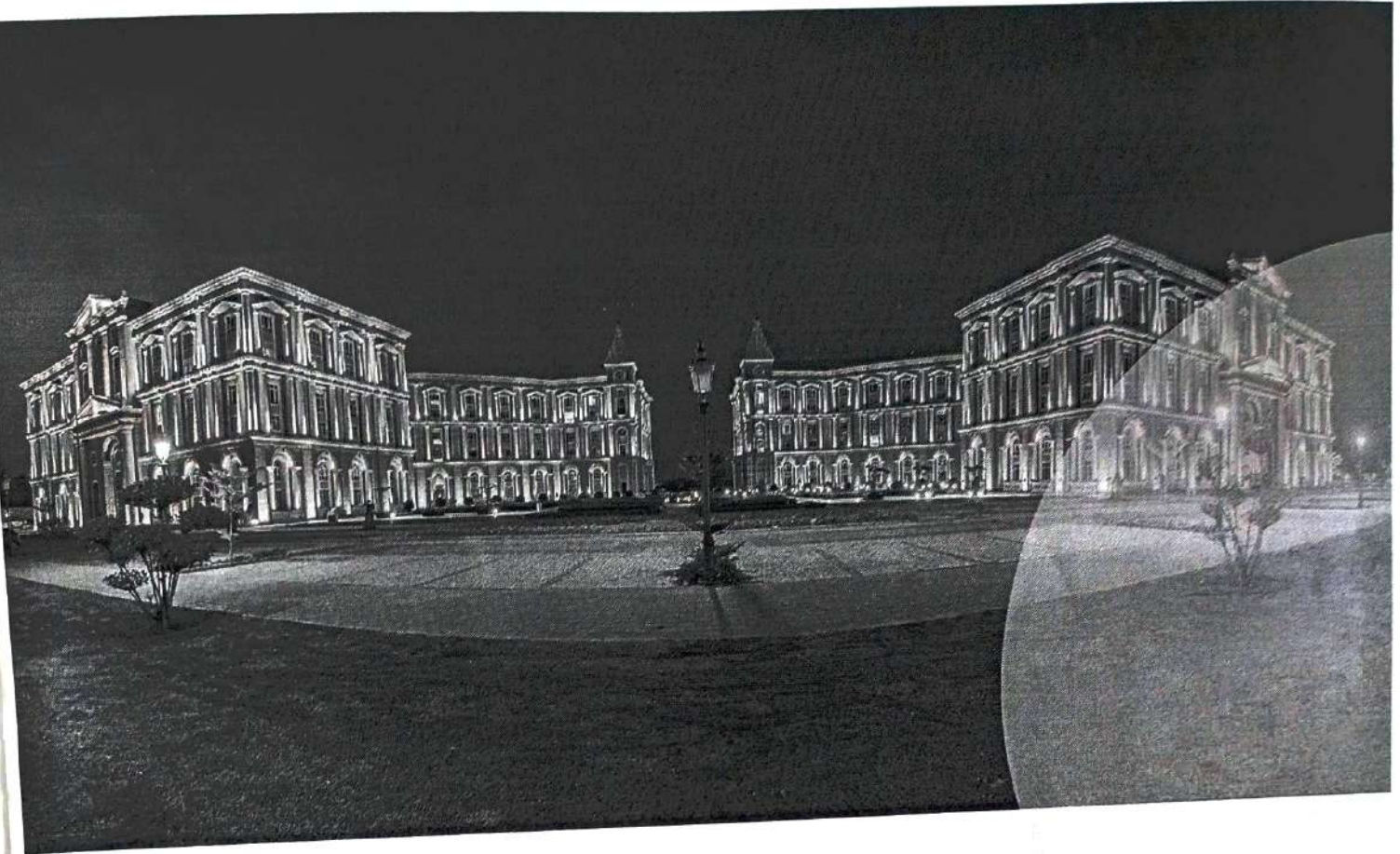

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1. Introduction of the Event

The College of Physiotherapy, under the School of Health Sciences, Dayananda Sagar University, organized an Alumni Seminar titled **“From Classroom to Clinic: What Students Must Be Ready For”** on **14th March 2026**. The session was delivered by distinguished alumna **Dr. Sayali Banole (PT)**, Assistant Professor, Dhole Patil College of Physiotherapy, Pune.

The session was conducted online for Final Year BPT students, interns, and alumni with the objective of preparing participants for the transition from academic classroom learning to real clinical practice. While physiotherapy education builds strong theoretical and clinical foundations, students often face a gap when moving from structured classroom learning to the practical realities of patient care. The session provided valuable insights into what students must be ready for as they step into clinical settings.

Dr. Sayali shared her experience as an academician working closely with interns and students, offering practical guidance on clinical expectations, professional conduct, and the skills required to succeed during internships and early clinical practice.

Overall, the session served as a valuable and practical platform, preparing students for a confident and smooth transition from classroom learning to clinical practice.

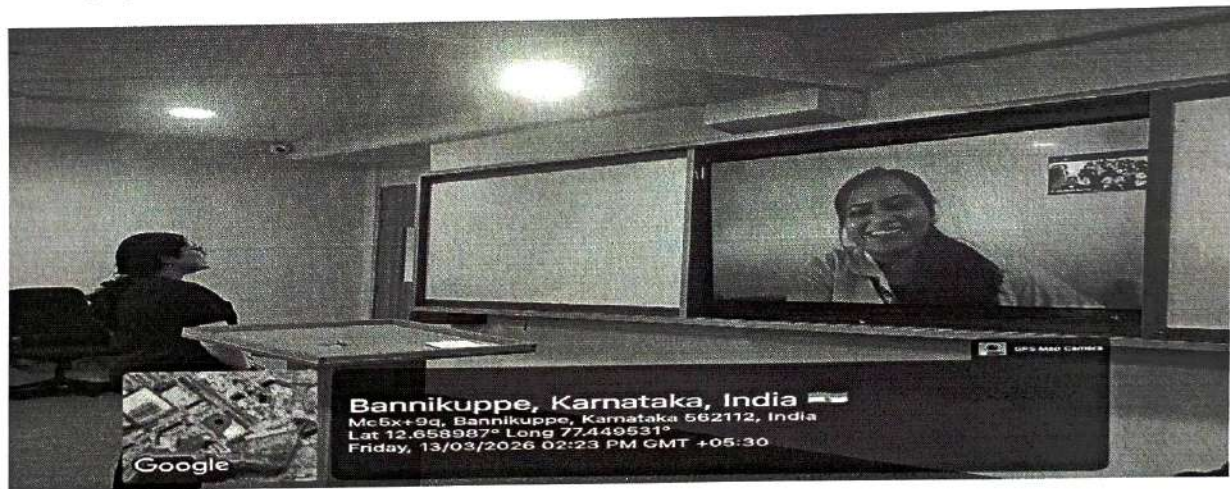
